Introduction

The "European Reform University Alliance" (ERUA), funded by the European Commission as part of the Erasmus+ European Universities Initiative, was launched on November 1st, 2020.

The project partners are the University of Paris 8 (France), which is the coordinator of the alliance, the University of Konstanz (Germany), the University of the Aegean (Greece), the University of Roskilde (Denmark) and the New Bulgarian University (Bulgaria).

As an alliance made of reform universities, our mission is to address the global challenges by bringing together students, academics and administrative staff from all areas of Europe and from all socio-economic backgrounds, to contribute towards reshaping a more just, open and inclusive society.

What?

ERUA gives you an opportunity to establish collaboration in your particular field of interest with colleagues from our ERUA partner universities. The **ERUA Teaching Exchanges** are meant as a first step to get to know the partners: You can set up initial contacts via a virtual or physical exchange within the framework of your seminar or lecture and thus draw out opportunities for further cooperation.

Since 2020, three kinds of exchanges emerged from the initiative:

- One-way guest lecture
- Back and forth guest lectures
- Lecture series

However, options are not limited to these formats and others can be explored, according to your teaching practices.

Who can participate?

All members of the teaching staff can apply (Professors, Postdocs, PhDs).

When?

The Teaching Exchange can take place when it is convenient for you, and mobility periods have to be mutually defined and agreed upon between the incoming teacher and the host. Please keep in mind that the partner universities have different semester schedules.

Where?

From and to all the member universities of ERUA. Physical exchanges are much encouraged. Virtual lectures are also an option.

Physical travels are funded with **Erasmus+ Teaching Mobility**. Contact your home university for more information.
